Christmas Music from St Chad's Cathedral: a recently released limited C.D. of traditional Christmas music featuring our own choir recorded at St Chad's in collaboration with Aid to the Church in Need, with ALL profits going to support their missionary work. The Pugin Society annual study tour this year explores the Gothic Revival in Hampshire and Wiltshire: 18-21 August. Based in Salisbury and staying in Sarum College in the Close, the tour will visit, among other things, the remains of Beckford's Fonthill, the eighteenth century Catholic chapel at Wardour, the superb Italianate estate church of St Mary and St Nicholas in Wilton, Christchurch Priory where AWN Pugin's first wife is buried, Highcliffe Castle, Sway Tower, and St Michael and All Angels at Lyndhurst with work by Morris and Leighton, and what must be the only cinema entrance designed by A.W.N. Pugin. The tour is led by Dr James Jago of University of York. Cost: £425 single and £395 per person sharing. Includes admission charges, coaches, accommodation with breakfast, and two evening meals, wine reception in the Cloisters.
