**Parish Visitation by Bishop David Evans on weekend of 21<sup>st</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2023** – It is one of the roles of the Diocesan Bishop to make a Pastoral Visitation of his Diocese over a period of time. In our Archdiocese it tends to be every 6-8 years for each parish. As part of the current Deanery Visitation across the Cathedral and South Birmingham Deanery, Bishop David Evans has asked to come to the Cathedral Parish this October. This is an opportunity to welcome the Bishop and to give him a sense of what our parish means to us at this point in its history. We can reflect with him on our perceived strengths and on the challenges we face. Bishop David will celebrate all of the Masses that weekend and we hope that as many people as possible will take the time to speak with him, especially where time allows after the Masses.
